Nomination forms will be available on Sunday at church. Thank you.

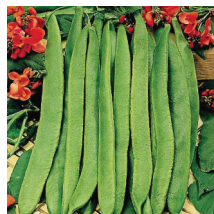

Safeguarding during Sunday service times

As part of our commitment to safeguarding, we have been reviewing the Garden café foyer access area, and how we use this space during worship services.

We are trialing nominating a volunteer to be responsible for that area during services, and to encourage people to try and avoid using that area while services are on. However, the Crèche will still be available in the Garden café, and those with younger children or with a need for this freer space, are encouraged still to use this area.

If you are someone that needs space to move around or fresh air at times during the service, please can we ask that you use the space in the main foyer or outside the front through the main entrance to church.

If you need the toilet, please try and use the ones at the main entrance to Church. However, if you need mobility access or baby changing, please do still use the ones up the corridor.

Also, the Garden café foyer door will be locked once the service has started. If you have mobility issues there will still be access possible from this door, we will come and open it for you.

The lounge

Unfortunately, the lounge is going to be out of action for the foreseeable future as Dry rot was found recently. We are progressing quickly with the process of treating and eradicating the issue, so that the lounge can be restored for usage as soon as possible.

Church Meeting

Bereavement friendship group

Church for all (60-100) feedback

There was some great feedback at our recent 'Church for all Session'.

The general feeling was that everyone is enjoying the attempts to balance all age worship for younger and older folk.

When James asked how we could intentionally be more inclusive and welcoming of those of us that are 60-100 years old. Some great discussions were had including -

Sound - PA system

Different microphones

Sitting and standing in worship

Hymns and songs - the gaps between verses/chorus

Contribution to church life of older generations - through prayer, investing in others and being a witness

Quiet prayers before and after service in the Ethel Webber room

James closed the session by thanking everyone and reminding everyone how their presence in church is valued, appreciated and serves as an amazing witness to younger people regarding examples of long term commitments of faith. Also, how for some - when it maybe easier to stay at home due to aches, pain or medical conditions - of how overcoming these and still making it to church was a powerful witness to younger folk of the importance of being a part of the body of Christ.

James ended the session by asking people

to reflect on if they could think of one person who had invested in their life and their faith to get them to this point and the importance of them in our lives and how we can invest in others.

James thanked everyone there for the investment that they were making in the next generations who will be sitting in their chairs in times to come. We left with the image of planting trees in faith for others to sit in their shade.

Trinity

As promised, Trinity will be starting back! The next session will be on Tuesday the 7th May 7-8:30 pm at PBC.

Trinity is a conversational group where faith topics can be discussed in a positive, encouraging and inclusive space. There is the freedom to bring topics important to you, or be led by others, or to reflect on the things that we are talking about in our Sunday service.

This is an open group, so please do come along, all are welcome.

Fellowship for Children

I am sure we all appreciate the joy of spending time with each other after the service. We want our children and young people to have the same benefit! As a result both halls will be designated spaces for them for up to half an hour after the end of the service. The main hall (middle one) will be used for physical games such as football or basketball and is unsupervised. The Doidge hall (top one) will be used for quieter activities and we have a range of games and activities that can be used, or children/young people can just relax, have refreshments and chat with their friends. We are encouraging them to take responsibility for getting out and packing away resources. The Doidge hall will be supervised, but please note that although you are welcome to leave your child(ren) unattended here, we cannot be responsible for them if they leave the hall. By providing this space for our children and young people we hope they will deepen friendships and experience the great benefits of Christian fellowship.

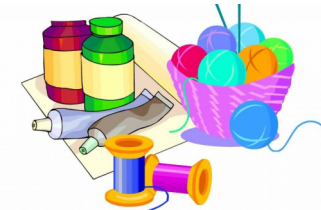
PA Update Team
